For the reasons given below, these investigations must also be extended to the former Health Minister Spahn and the board members of BioNTech SE.

Dear Prosecutors,

In order to further illustrate the systematic failure of those responsible at STIKO - and thus at the same time of the PEI and the current Federal Minister of Health Lauterbach and his predecessor Spahn - I would like to add a few explanations and notes to my criminal complaint.

a)

It should first be recalled that the founding fathers and mothers of the Basic Law stated in Article 79.3 of the Basic Law that the principles laid down in Articles 1 and 20 of the Basic Law in particular should also be unchangeable.

Against the background of the experiences with the National Socialist regime of terror, human dignity and the rule of law should never again be up for negotiation.

In its decision from 2006 on the nullity of the authorization to shoot down in the Aviation Security Act (judgment of February 15, 2006 - 1 BvR 357/05), the BVerfG decided that it is not compatible with the fundamental right to life and the guarantee of human dignity, "as far

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as the deployment people on board the aircraft who were not involved in the use of force are affected. Consequently, nobody can be forced to sacrifice his own life, especially not if the alleged savior is not a "vaccination" but a genetic intervention and - as explained - is demonstrably ineffective or even negatively effective.

Politicians have not only - contrary to Art. 7 S. 2 IPbürgR - exerted maximum pressure on people in various forms, which can only be qualified as coercion in office so that they can miss a highly experimental Covdi-19 injection.

Was it actually ever determined because of such statements?

From the case law of the Federal Constitutional Court cited above, it follows that human dignity is violated when the lives of innocent people are sacrificed.

It is the same when people are forced to sacrifice their lives and health, which - as I said - must apply all the more if this sacrifice is completely pointless because these Covid-19 injections have no relevant protective effect.

The entire Covid-19 injection agenda, in particular this unspeakable so-called SpahnVO, has trampled on the principles of the rule of law and in particular the dignity of all people, especially the dignity of the soldiers who, since November 24th, 2021, have in fact been subject to a Covid-19 injection obligation in accordance with § 17 a SG are subject. This inglorious chapter must also be dealt with.

So when I'm asked again and again whether the former Federal Health Minister Spahn also needs to be investigated, the answer is clear:

This "Spahn-VO" alone embodies a targeted attack on the life and health of all people in this country.

No one should and should not be compelled to carry out such an experiment, if only because of Art.

In order to avoid repetitions, I refer to my criminal complaint against the STIKO dated February 26, 2023.

"As of January 2020, BioNTech was still primarily a cancer immunotherapy-focused company."(p. 151) [...] "Since numerous influenza vaccines already existed, it was also easy to assess how well drugs based on the technologies in BioNTech's ever-expanding mRNA toolkit really worked by comparing them to conventional vaccines . In 2011, the company secured grants from the German government for this pilot program, which Ugur and Özlem deliberately kept a secret." (p. 152)

So you got money from the federal government for mRNA vaccines against influenza as early as 2011?

I wanted to take a closer look at that, which is currently annoying because you're getting more and more information about the broth from the last few years and you have to dig a little deeper if you want older information about this biotech crap. There were probably a total of three grants from the BMBF (Federal Ministry of Education and Research)[3]:

Two grants as part of the biotechnology start-up campaign (GO-Bio) between 2007 and 2013 (totalling 4.1 million euros)[4] in the founding phase of BioNTech.

Beneficiary: University Medicine at Johannes Gutenberg University Mainz

Funding: GO-Bio Phase I (03/01/2007 to 02/28/2010, 1,242,119 euros)

Beneficiary: BioNTech RNA Pharmaceuticals GmbH

Funding: GO-Bio Phase II (03/01/2010 to 12/31/2013, 2,892,862 euros)

Another funding by the cluster "Ci3- Cluster for individualized immune intervention" from 2012 to 2017.[5]

The company also benefited from further project funding from the BMBF from the special program launched in June 2020 to accelerate research and development of vaccines against SARS-CoV-2[6].

I couldn't find anything about influenza, except for this phrase "vaccines for immunotherapy of cancer". That doesn't sound like influenza. The 2011 funding can actually only have been Go-Bio Phase II.

As was already written in the foreword, some of the dates could not be remembered so precisely. It may also be part of it that you think you remember that there was money for an mRNA vaccine for or against influenza at the time. Without looking at the funding agreements, I can't really say anything specific here.

However. So you want to compare it to flu vaccines, which Cochrane says actually didn't work very well and still doesn't work[7]. Even the BMBF admitted this in 2015 for old people[8th].

That can be fun. Especially since Fauci himself has now admitted that influenza vaccines are for the bin. OK, he puts it more scientifically politely as "less than suboptimal".

If we translate sub-optimal as "not particularly good" then less than sub-optimal is: scrap or straight to the bin!

Flu vaccines would never have been approved by today's standards[9], which means a lot, after even the modRNA lethal injection received at least conditional approval. Flu vaccines are soooooooooo useless, even at the extremely low standards that are currently used as

"Two years later, they hired their first infectious disease specialist. At first, Stephanie Erbar did not have the impression that she was working on a particularly important BioNTech project. About her colleagues who developed cancer therapies, she says: "They were afraid of getting infected. I was only allowed to work in the lab in the afternoons or evenings when nobody else was there." Their first place of work was in a room called "Dead Pigeon" because there was a rotting bird lying on the skylight (p. 152)"

If you look at LinkedIn, Stephanie Erbar started at BioNTech in 2013 as Project Manager -Senior Scientist. She became Head of Infectious disease vaccines in September 2016 and has been Head of Infectious disease vaccines since October 2020. She studied (2001-2006) and did her doctorate (2006-2010) in Marburg, followed by a postdoc in Marburg (2010-2013). Since her name is thankfully not very common, her scientific work can be followed well on Pubmed[16]. She probably did her doctorate on the Nipah virus and did research in Andrea Maisner's laboratory[17], which unfortunately does not have an alumni section on its website.

Stephanie is at least one of the co-authors of one of the Drosden Papers[18]. In 2018, already at BioNTech, she published a paper entitled "Self-replicating RNA vaccines offer equivalent protection against influenza as mRNA vaccines, but at much lower doses[19]." After we learned that influenza vaccines are less than useless... Connect the dots!

A virologist once told me that as a PhD student in virology, you are welcomed as a member of the family. The virologists would all be like a small family. Sort of like the mafia, I guess. La Famiglia[20]sticks together and whoever betrays them has to pay a high personal price, like this doctor specializing in virology. Anyone who opposes the family gets in trouble. Stephanie Erbar is part of the family. You know each other. she knows dr Osden, he knows Fauci (you know that from the Fauci emails, Drosden was partly one of the direct recipients). Stephanie Erbar works for BioNTech. Incidentally, the Nipha virus also leads back to the Wuhan Institute of Virology via Fauci[21]. Of course it could be coincidence. Many groups are researching on this virus. BioNTech gets the proline lock info from Fauci's institute. I already worked through the Proline lock in an earlier substack. A small, cuddly family of virologists.

Annette Vogel[22]will be added in 2014 (p. 153). She also has an easily accessible LinkedIn profile[23]. Biology studies in Göttingen from 2002-2004, then 2004-2008

master's degree in Tübingen and traineeship at Spektrum Verlag (2006-2007), around 6 years at the Friedrich-Loeffler-Institut[24] to do a doctorate on the island of Riems and do postdoc rounds. Annette Vogel is the first author of the paper claiming that the BioNTech lethal injection kills macaques[25] (these are monkeys) would protect against the Chinese flu[26].

Oddly enough, I haven't read about these monkey experiments in the book I'm fileting here. They probably didn't want to upset the minds of the readers with primate experiments, I guess. Which confuses me even more. How could such unbelievably bad English, including typos, become a Nature paper?! It should read "rather than a model of COVID-10 disease". A spelling mistake and a syntax mistake in half a sentence in a Nature Paper speaks for me as someone who wanted to be an English teacher against a peer review of any kind. THAT should have been noticed, even if you don't understand the subject matter.

In 2015, another scientist joined the BioNTech team, but he was not named (p. 153).

This is followed by the previously mentioned (unsuccessful) HIV projects (led by Imperial College London), "collaborative projects with Bayer's veterinary division on livestock vaccines and with the University of Pennsylvania on a variety of pathogens. This was followed by a cooperation with the Bill and Melinda Gates Foundation and in 2018 a major project with Pfizer on the flu." (p. 153)

Imperial College, wasn't there something with Neil Ferguson? But I had already dealt with that in Part 3, Chapter 2[28].

At this point, the author of the chapter quotes the BioNTech company website and not a single scientific paper or clinical study!

From this I conclude that it was a sentence with an X, so that was probably NIX or to put it more politely "But while companies that also work with mRNA, such as Moderna and CureVac, started clinical trials with vaccines against infectious diseases, similar programs from BioNTech remained, where still prioritized cancer projects, in the exploratory phase."

There is a table of what a scientist says and what a scientist means by it. This list was on the joke board in every lab back then, although it was NOT A JOKE[29]. Exploration phase, of course.

Because Moderna has admitted that their modRNA vaccine against influenza performed even worse than the classics[30][31][32], which are already "not very good" according to Fauci and Cochrane, I probably don't need to say much more about that.

"When Ugur started "Project Lightspeed", the unit, which was explicitly concerned with infectious diseases and was now headed by Annette Vogel, consisted of just fifteen people."(p.154)

On p. 155 one finally begins to distinguish between the different forms of RNA, something the book has so far failed to do (perhaps in the hope that most readers have already given up digging through the book, or the book for the same Destiny suffers like Mein Kampf, the most unread book in history, right after Klaus Schwab's Great Reset I bought my copy used and unread because I didn't want to throw money down the authors' throats, ie Project Lightspeed ", not "The Great Reset". I actually read "The Great Reset" and the book could be filleted in a normal review with a little overlength).

However, since in the previous chapter (Chapter 4), Karikós and Weissmann's invention of modRNA was treated historically (albeit skipping any supporting evidence in the form of footers) comes bio-mRNA, as I call it, the normal mRNA chemical molecule , and the modRNA (the pseudoridyl variant by Karikó and Weissman, which was ultimately used and gave the company Moderna its name) a few other RNAs that were also to be tested in parallel.

Funnily enough, BioNTech has to license the technique developed by their colleague Karikó because the rights belong to the university that filed the patent. If you want to know why this is so, you should read my substack on patents at universities[33]read.

This patent is one of the pink unicorns that feeds the unemployed sci-fi authors of the rest of the university patents.

As if the current cabinet of horrors with the variations of modRNA in use and the damage that modRNA is already doing wasn't bad enough, BioNTech also offers in its portfolio "Self-amplifying mRNA, or saRNA, and transamplifying mRNA, taRNA, ' (p. 156).

If you thought modRNA was bad, give thanks on your knees, whoever it may be, that saRNA wasn't used[34]. If you want to know more about that, you can read the quoted article by Jessica Rose. It's too specialized here and I don't want to send anyone straight into a coma with these details. To put it bluntly: the SA during Hitler's time could not have spread more fear and terror among resistance fighters than the concept of saRNA among scientists with common sense and conscience.

"Their reluctance [...] was also because there was no knowledge of how these technologies would work in combination with each new lipid. Years earlier, while optimizing their cancer vaccines, Uğur and Özlem had discovered that these encapsulants lead to a "multiplication of the effect of the mRNA". Not only could the composition of these fat globules be tailored to allow for intravenous or intramuscular delivery of the mRNA, but it could also regulate the exact destination of the molecule, allowing vaccine developers to choose the organs and cell types to which they wanted to deliver their cargo . How the lipid chosen for "Project Lightspeed" would perform in combination with the company's individual mRNA platforms remained an open question."(p. 157)

How was that again in chapter 2[35] with the cationic nanolipids that the PEI wanted to accuse as safe and already approved? As a reminder: "Ugur and Özlem's team had to find a way to present the Paul Ehrlich Institute with an already existing lipid formulation that had already been approved by the drug authorities." (p.77)

So we have here not only a problem with the cationic nanolipids themselves, but also with the combination of the content, the effect of which could be multiplied and this combined with different mRNA variants, which all behave differently in the body.

What can go wrong if you start a blind flight? This will certainly work without any errors on the first try, definitely, word of honour!

You could see in the Pfizer documents how well the addressing of the destination worked[36], the cationic nanolipids spread everywhere and that's not really surprising. When you inject a drug into the muscle, you want one thing above all: that this substance

be distributed quickly and evenly in the body, which is why you inject it into the muscle. You learn that in medical school. Ugur and Özlem are both doctors, even internists, oncologists and immunologists. How can they even begin to think that a substance injected into a muscle will stay in place or go to a specific location in the body?

Biology is always about gradients. Even if a large part of a certain substance is preferentially found in a certain area of the organism, it can be found in lower concentrations in other areas. Gradients, concentrations, ratios of concentrations to one another have a regulatory function and are only partially understood, which is why there was a Nobel Prize 25 years ago[37] for this. And that was just for gradients in embryos of Drosophila melanogaster, the pesky fruit fly. Humans have not yet reached the beginning of understanding.

The cationic nanolipids are industrial fats. Fat and fat like to mingle. Where do you think a fat molecule will go? In fatty organs maybe? "It could also regulate the exact destination of the molecule, allowing vaccine developers to select the organs and cell types" I think is a misconception born of ignorance or overconfidence, thinking you can win against biology and its laws. Anyone who believes this will fail!

Nobody can win against biology and its biological laws or Mother Nature and the laws of nature ALWAYS! This should be clear to anyone who has even a rudimentary understanding of their biology degree, and this also applies to medicine as a specialized subsection of biology in the university pecking order.

Who hasn't heard of the university pecking order in the natural sciences. Here she is:

Physics is applied mathematics.

Chemistry is applied physics.

Biology is applied chemistry.

Medicine is applied biology.

As a biologist, one was glad not to be at the bottom of the pecking order and still had a discipline to look down on. While being bullied by the other faculties as a humanities discipline under the sciences, while medicine was seen as the craftsman under the sciences. It may not be a coincidence, after all, that the discipline at the very bottom of the intellectual-scientific pecking order triggered this disaster, admittedly with a little help from the second-place discipline from behind.

"The task of these new lipids was the same as that of the cancer vaccines: to transport the mRNA to the dendritic cells,"(p. 158)

That sounded somehow different on RTL: "The active ingredient can stay in the muscle for a few hours and the body has time to recognize it and react to it, explains the Rostock virologist Andreas Podbielski[38].[39]"

What now? Muscle or dendritic cells located in the lymph nodes and primarily in surface tissues of the body such as the skin, throat, esophagus, vagina, cervix and anus and in the internal mucous membranes. THAT doesn't really sound to me as if you could optimize it specifically for an organ. The dendritic cells are well and strategically distributed almost everywhere in the body.

That's called an oxymoron in literary terms, by the way. The oxymoron is a rhetorical figure using two contradictory or mutually exclusive terms, such as black horse or straight curve. What is being planned here is a biological medical oxymoron, but no one seems to notice.

I just want to make sure I'm not getting this all right: You want to "transport the mRNA (again, you don't differentiate between RNA types) to the dendritic cells" so that the vaccine developers could select the organs and cell types. "Which of the organs in which the dendritic cells are supposed to be? There are so many! As a doctor, you have certainly learned in which organs you can find dendritic cells and if not: It's even in Wikipedia[40]! Wikipedia is of course not a scientific source, but you can look at the footnotes.

"There was only one intramuscular lipid that could go into production for clinical trials at any time: a formulation from Acuitas that BioNTech initially planned to test in the partnered project with Pfizer to develop a flu vaccine. It was this lipid formulation that the couple and their team presented to the German regulator at their first meeting in February."(p. 158)

I detailed the problem with the Acuitas Nanolipids that nearly ruined Moderna in my analysis of Chapter 2. That's just a blatant lie at this point! Now on page 158 the confirmation in black and white: BioNTech has sold the Acuitas nanolipids to the PEI, which Moderna listed as safe in its investor report as a safety hazard!

I had guessed correctly in part 3 of this series.

Conveniently, one omits the name of the lipid (ALC-0315) at this point, as well as supporting this claim that they had been developing for years would make more or less effective. (p. 158)"

Whenever things get exciting, the endnotes are missing in "Project Lightspeed". To date, I have not seen a single safety data sheet for this substance where the LD50 was determined for injection. LD50 is the index that indicates the amount of a substance at which half of the test animals died. This identifier was not determined for ALC-0315. So how do you know if this substance is safe? If someone should have these data and animal experiments, please leave them in the comment function. This data would be of great interest to me and many other scientists.

"Moderna and CureVac, who both started coronavirus vaccine projects, had a lot of clinical data on the combination of mRNA formats and lipid formulations they planned to use. BioNTech does not. (p. 158)"

Cleverly worded. Moderna and CureVac have a lot of clinical data. I can't say what CureVac's data says, but what Moderna had in terms of data wasn't exactly clear from the Chapter 2 analysis. The nanolipids are an old problem, Moderna was definitely aware of that[41], because they actually had a lot of clinical data, from FAILED trials. It sounds somehow different here on page 158 when Joe or Ugur put it that way.

"They would test twenty different candidates for a Covid-19 vaccine, in different dosages and in parallel. These were vaccine candidates that submitted modRNA, uRNA, and saRNA embedded in the lipids of Acuitas to test the full spike protein and its RBD portion alone as vaccine antigens. [...] . In order not to lose any time, vaccine batches were produced from day one to the high standards required for clinical testing.(p.159)"

They contained up to 4000 nucleotides and had to be assembled from fifty to eighty smaller building blocks to form a perfect, error-free code consisting of the nucleotides G, A, T, C. After completion, the sequences had to be cloned and checked for correctness. [...]"(p. 160)

I don't want to doubt Steffi's abilities now, even though I think I know her personally from my time at the University of Freiburg. There was a Stefanie Hein; she did her doctorate with Professor Wolfgang Hess, for whom I worked as a project administrator for third-party funds of a BMBF project called FRISYS. I don't remember Stefanie very well, she found her rather inconspicuous: bond, with curly hair and thick-rimmed glasses, a little stockier build, below average height, definitely smaller than me. One day she stood amazed in my office and looked at my greenhouses in which I grew my tomatoes, passion fruit and cactus plants for the garden (so it must have been February/March) and asked amazed where I got the seeds from. I thought I scraped them out of the fruit which I brought for lunch. She was amazed that you can just scrape seeds out of fruit and they will become plants again. At the time, Steffi was already doing her doctorate at the Faculty of Biology 2 at the University of Freiburg. Stefanie Hein has no reasearchgate profile, no Xing or LinkedIn profile. BUT there is still Pubmed[49]. And who do we find there on a BioNTech paper, in which the broth is supposed to protect monkeys from a disease that they cannot get and at the same time on the AG Hess papers... my Steffi, whom I only remember because of the conversation about flower seeds and their knowledge gap at the elementary school level. That's similar to the 360° Baebock quote I guess in terms of the size of the education gap.

This Steffi Hein is named as the "scientist responsible for BioNTech's "RNA depot"" (p. 160). Kind of stupid for them that I knew them personally (and two other current BioNTech employees).

So Stefanie personally grabbed the pipette and made the prototypes of the bioweapon after she hadn't worked in the laboratory for 2 years. Brave. After 2 years, I would carefully register as an intern with the TA (technical staff) in a laboratory and get instructed again before I mess up, now, after 15 years, even more so.

In my time there was a professor (now emeritus) whose name I will not mention. He was a microbiologist and now and then had the feeling that he would like to do some practical work on the bench again. If he expressed this urge to a co-worker or his secretary, the lab would panic. Everything that was irreplaceable was hidden. Hid everything that was important. Was quick to label everything properly because he tended to just teach unlabeled chemicals down the drain as a lesson. Things have ended up in the sewage that should have been disposed of separately, just when you're wondering what the safety measures at the university are like.

The stage was set for him. An illusion of a laboratory that actually didn't exist in reality. A Matrix version of the lab. Or as Shakespeare would say "All the world is a stage"[50].

He accidentally ventilated the anaerobic tent (a special chamber where you work with bacteria that don't tolerate oxygen) and still shut down the lab for several days, despite doing everything you could to prevent such failures.

So Steffi grabs the pipette herself. After 2 years of abstinence.

"No matter how hard Hein and her team tried, they couldn't combine all the nucleotides in the right order and fuse the segments correctly in the right order. They tried all sorts of solutions, but every time they analyzed cloned templates, something was wrong in the sequence."(p. 160)

Now why am I not surprised?

And if the problem occurs routinely on a small scale, how likely is it that these problems will possibly, perhaps, fatally occur every now and then in mass production and then be overlooked? Since the final product was unfortunately never officially sequenced by the authorities, we will probably never know. The authorities have not even determined the concentration[51].

But what has actually been sequenced, by independent scientists, and then published on Substack definitely has a problem. Namely, double-stranded plasmid DNA was found[52]. If someone is reading along who is familiar with eukaryotic genetics (i.e. genetics of living beings with a cell nucleus), ideally human genetics, and would like to take a closer look at it with me: Please get in touch with me. I'm unfortunately from prokaryotes (bacteria) genetics. I'm not sure if you can transfect a human with a bacterial plasmid. The intestinal bacteria can certainly be transfected with this construct, as can the rest of our microbiome, which could then also start producing spike protein. I certainly don't need to start at this point with the consequences of the transfer of the plasmid from bacterium to bacterium in a sewage treatment plant or wherever in the wild. That leads to a rat's tail of problems, it gives you gray hair.[53]. Very ugly!

"The first vaccine candidate was available as a DNA template at the end of February."(p. 162)

When the first smurf substance candidate was ready at the end of February 2020, the test animals were then injected with it in January 2020[54]?

I'm only asking because I'm a little confused. BioNTech's FDA filed document R-20-0072 125742_S1_M4_4223_R-20-0072 states on page 8 that the animal studies from 14.-23. January 2020 took place. If BioNTech does not also have a flux capacitor[55]owns, we have a timing problem here that either makes this book a fictional novel that I can dissect as I please, or degrades the data submitted to the FDA to a product of fantasy.Possibly even both apply. Or perhaps the leading scientists were simply suffering from dementia and lost track of the day, month and year and are now already in a nursing home where the problem is being taken care of professionally.

Unfortunately, the document submitted, in the currently accessible form, is severely mutilated due to blackening, although toner-saving procedures have been used here and light gray has been used. But one thing is clear: the mice were killed early and there is therefore no data on how long the animals would have lived after the injection. That would have been interesting too. Does the product shorten the lifespan of rodents?

You probably just didn't want to know that exactly. Quite apart from the fact that the least sensitive test (luciferase) was used so that nothing could be found that could interfere, which Robert Malone has already commented on at length[56][57].

"Trials with rodents, carried out in a separate location, followed. Groups of eight mice each were given the vaccine candidates at three different doses: low, medium and high."(p. 163)

Aside from the fact that low, medium, and high are completely useless quantities and suggest more of a spatial orientation, where is the data? According to Buch, the 20 constructs mentioned were tested on 8 mice in three different doses each. That makes 20x8x3=480 mice. I repeat: where is the data?

Certainly not in document R-20-0072 125742_S1_M4_4223_R-20-0072.

"After the rodents were all vaccinated and checked for signs of side effects, they were bled at intervals for six weeks to do hundreds of tests to see if the vaccine worked or not."(p. 163)

Now I'm not a math genius like Ugur, but 14.-23. January 2020, that makes 9 days.Or maybe I just have the wrong document. If anyone has the document to which the book text refers, please write in the comments.

According to Buch the mice are injected with the smurf substance on March 9th (p.170).

So you can't just be wrong about the month, not a single number is correct here!

"To find out whether the antibodies did this job, Vogel's team had to develop a 'gold standard', the virus neutralization test (VNT)."(p.164)

So you pull a detection method out of your fingers that nobody has checked and claims that it is now the gold standard. I'll just let the reader judge for themselves how trustworthy these results are.

With this gold standard, BioNTech proceeds as follows:

"BioNTech's teams cultured the virus and added it to healthy cells, along with a serum containing potentially neutralizing antibodies. After five days, it was checked whether the cells had been destroyed – or whether the infection had been prevented."(p. 164)

Unpurified serum that also contains complement proteins and lysozyme (i.e. the NONSPECIFIC components of the innate immune system)[58], you flip to cell culture and you decide that it was the antibodies of whatever nature that neutralized the virus and not the components of the innate immune system?

It also ignores the variability of the immune system between individual mice. Once again work with professionals, I say here again. Did these "scientists" actually even hear the introductory lecture on the immune system?

Ugur is supposedly an immunologist, he should know that his "gold standard" is simply useless for what he claims to want to prove or just doesn't want to prove.

Alex Music[59]page 167 comes up with another "terrific" idea.

"Instead of using samples that contained live coronaviruses, Muik said the company could fall back on its old acquaintance, the vesicular stomatitis virus. [...] In this way, a pseudovirus was created that contained the part of the coronavirus that BioNTech hoped to target with its vaccines, but was unable to cause Covid-19. Muik's construct was just a harmless impersonator."

So you didn't even test against an artificially produced nature-identical corona virus, but against a COMPLETELY DIFFERENT VIRUS[60], which infects ungulates, which could possibly behave differently than the virus one is trying to combat. So you worked with a so-called pseudovirus, which you implanted an artificial spike sequence from a Chinese database, without EVER having isolated the real virus anywhere, nowhere on this planet. Not until today (03/2023). Why not phage display? You can buy that at least standardized as a kit. Whether I take a virus that causes colds in ungulates and cannot infect humans or bacterial viruses (phages) directly, ultimately makes no difference in MONKEY cell culture.

Here we are at a point that I have already explained in detail in my article on protein engineering[61]. You attach the spike protein to another virus, replacing its "feet" or "spikes". This can bend these proteins because they are now attached to a different shell, which is just different. Maybe different surface curvature, maybe different protein production rates, making folding slower, faster, or just different. Phage display, or in this case ungulate virus display, can work, but it doesn't have to. You should first prove that it works with this protein. Has this been proven with positive and negative controls? Another problem is that the spike protein may not only use ACE2 to enter the cell, but so-called co-receptors. It is currently believed that the spike protein may use co-receptors to enter the cell^[62], but did not identify her. So even if the monkey cell lines used had been humanized (which has not been done), these previously unknown receptors would certainly not have been humanized. Humanized means that a human ACE2 receptor has been installed instead of a monkey ACE2. Unknown co-receptors, however, cannot be humanized because they are not known, hence UNKNOWN. You should have checked that beforehand. Does the Spike Protein use co-receptors? Yes or no? Has that been checked?

It also doesn't make you suspicious that a Chinese company "Sino Biological, which also had a location just west of Frankfurt, offered its customers a DNA template that encoded the entire sequence of the coronavirus spike protein." (p. 169)

Mind you, only a THEN template, not a virus isolate. They're all playing with the fantasy product from the database, the origin of which can be traced back to a bioweapons laboratory (in the Ukraine (also in a town called Chyna[63]), the USA or China).

"However, in the total number of cells in each dish, even in the absence of antibodies, only a small number of cells are infected: 500 out of 40,000. Looking through the microscope, the resolution did not allow us to see the difference between 500 and 50 infected cells, to determine how effective a vaccine was. Over the next few weeks, Alex Muik and his only collaborator, Bianca Sänger, tried to improve the method and test it on a variety of devices at their disposal."(p. 174)

At this point, the problem of dissolution is actually completely irrelevant, because you have taken a virus that is not dangerous for monkey (cells) anyway.

Finally, on page 175, I don't know whether to laugh or cry:

"The antibody response stimulated by BioNTech's vaccine candidates was able to neutralize the potentially life-threatening infection in mice."

After some thought I decided to laugh hysterically, why compromise when you can have both.

Mouse medicine is the most advanced medicine this planet knows. There are various drugs that can cure Alzheimer's, cancer and various other terrible diseases in mice, at

least that's what they say. Only... they don't work in humans. Ugur may have invented a new mouse drug, at least according to monkey cell culture!

I'm not sure if it would also work in mice, because you use monkey cells (p.174) and an ungulate virus, which in my opinion doesn't necessarily allow conclusions to be drawn about rodents and certainly not about humans. I will therefore slowly explain the species chaos that has been created here.

As a reminder: monkeys and humans differ genetically by about 1% (=99% identical), bananas and humans by about 50% (=50% identical). People and mice allegedly differ "only" 2.5%[64](=97.5% identical). 2.5% - 1% = 1.5%. Mice are more different from apes than humans are from apes. So you conclude from the greater genetic difference between mouse and monkey that it will work in humans. I'm confused. Finally confused. And the hoofed animals are not included in this calculation. With my dusty math skills, that would be too many variables for me.

You take crude serum from MICE that have developed antibodies against a protein that infects HUMAN cells, dump it onto MONKEY CELLS, which you infect with an UNGULATE virus containing the HUMAN cell spike protein. And from this one concludes that the smurf substance will protect PEOPLE and not only mice or monkeys (which it does not protect because they cannot get Covid). Exactly. And again slowly!

Monkeys are a poor model because they can't get human COVID, so monkey cells were used to test a modified ungulate virus on these monkey cells to show that mouse antibodies were minimal to 10 in monkeys, which would not get sick from it anyway would work badly.

To be honest, at this point I'm no longer sure in which species the miracle drug would even work.

"It was just a small bulge in the curve, but it showed that an immune response was going on [...] These data did not yet indicate that the constructs developed by the Lightspeed team had elicited a T-cell response."(p. 176)

An immune response was going on. A minor immune response was going on. But what kind of immune response was actually going on? I have absolutely no idea. And probably not the BioNTech "scientists" either.

Part 6 (quote):

"Chapter 6 is dark and I have a hard time being funny and meanly sarcastic here. If my hypothesis were correct, that would be bad, very bad. However, it is only a hypothesis based on literary traces that can certainly be refuted with other passages in the text. I really hope so in this case!

As one learns very quickly in "Introduction to Literary Studies" (because otherwise one gets bad grades), one has to argue in literary essays in such a way that one can continue to talk one's mouth off. You are not allowed to cover watertightly and shut up the others.

As you can imagine, my first literary homework in English, which was still heavily influenced by scientific arguments and scientific articles (the so-called papers), was not particularly well received. This was possibly also due to my refusal to use useless

adjectives and adverbs. In my opinion, these have no real informational value and only inflate the text unnecessarily. This might be useful if you don't have enough to say to get past the minimum word limit, but if you have the opposite problem, just cut them out so you can say more (that was more my problem).

As a natural scientist, I was a foreign body in English studies, who irritated everyone and was therefore greeted by the professors in the corridor in the first semester. Maybe I shouldn't have refuted her in her lectures with Nature and Science Papers in front of the whole class. It was still funny when I argued against the doctrine in the state exam and won because they couldn't refute me. The examiner from the office said goodbye to me with the words "Sincere condolences. You will not be happy at school."

I love intellectually dangerous, narrow paths, which we will also embark on in this chapter.

In contrast to the previous chapters, in which I could either rant about the content or fillet it with footnotes, in Chapter 6 we now move, for a change, in a classic text analysis for the most part.

In Chapter 6 we finally learn what happened to Ugur's first biotech gossip called "Ganymed" and why it had to be sold. This possibly traumatic experience of loss for Özlem, which made dreams burst, was, in addition to the foundation for BioNTech, perhaps one of the causes of the disaster of the planned plandemic. Ugur maybe wanted to save his wife from losing another "baby" and that would have been the case in 2023 if a miracle hadn't happened or hadn't been calculated and faked. only by whom?

The question of guilt is anything but easy to clarify on the basis of this chapter. They have made sure - if the worst comes to the worst - that everyone is included in the downfall.

I had already suspected in previous chapters that Ugur only brought up this mess and the trappings to save BioNTech. The company was in debt at the time of the action with 400 million euros! (p. 62)

This chapter contains further hints in this direction, which confirm my suspicions. A loving husband wanted to save the love of his life from another loss and was willing to sacrifice the lives of millions of other people to do so.

Heroic, isn't it? This is true love. He lays millions of lives at the feet of his loved ones. Like in ancient Rome.

Ugur's hero worship and complex is larger than just encompassing the Marvel Universe. Of course, a real nerd also loves Lord of the Rings. Unfortunately, I couldn't find any references to Star Trek in the book, which I found a bit disappointing. Star Trek is definitely part of being a full-fledged Big Bang Theory nerd.

Ugur does not identify with Golum, as one might intuitively assume (for whatever reason), but with Frodo. Which shoe size do you think Ugur has?

"Ugur, who never intended to start his own company, compared the mission to that of the hobbit Frodo Baggins in Lord of the Rings, one of his favorite fantasy films. Frodo did not choose to be the ring-bearer, he told Özlem, nor to be responsible for the ring's destruction, but was forced to take on that task." (p. 181)

Ugur a hero against his will with Özlem as Sam? Or is the author trying to tell us at this point between the lines that he actually didn't want to take part in this Covid scam? But that he was forced to do so by the circumstances and somehow, maybe in 2018 at a WHO meeting, got into it against his will? There is a photo from 2018 where you can admire him on stage with Tedros, Merkel and Gates[1][2]. What is he doing there? He was not listed anywhere on the program as a keynote speaker, as I was told by someone who knows someone who was there live at the time (and took illicit photos). He gave a lecture on RNA technology as a therapy for cancer patients and allegedly mentioned vaccinations in passing at the end, as I was told by this well-informed source. The mainstream media likes to use this term "well-informed sources" for their lies. If push came to shove, I might be able to get this source to testify in court. The source really exists! However, some scientists currently have to remain anonymous because they love their job at the university.

Fun fact on the side: Ugur's confession that he loves Lord of the Rings could have put him on the UK anti-terrorist list in 2023 because the British anti-terrorist program classifies Shakespeare, Tolkien, Huxley and Orwell as dangerous literature[3].

You can also see it positively, Jane Austen and Dickens are apparently still harmless. It's kind of funny though that the book by the brother of the great eugenicist Sir Julian Sorell Huxley now ends up on a blacklist along with the propagandist of Elizabeth I, who by the way was one of those who used copyright censorship[4]invented. Apparently she wasn't strict enough with Will for today's anti-terrorist literary troops, and back then they were still beheaded...

"In the early years of Ganymede, Ugur and Özlem found the journey far less dangerous than that of the hobbit Frodo Baggins, their furry idol. Then, in 2007, the couple and their mentor, Austrian oncologist Christoph Huber, who had co-founded Ganymede six years earlier, found their backs to the wall. The start-up had several preclinical successes and, after two rounds of financing, was preparing for its first human clinical trial. But now Ganymede had to invest in expensive, large-scale studies, and money was tight. The Zurich-based venture capital firm Nextech, which had provided the seed capital for the company and is still its largest investor, wanted to exit the investment. The company had strict rules

"Biotech companies were born to die (emphasis mine): they either disappeared through acquisition or, much more commonly, through failure. Their other projects, codenamed NT (New Technologies), were too dear to the couple to suffer such a fate (emphasis mine). They could, Ugur believed, be financed with the sale of Ganymede and with grants from the federal government. It wouldn't be the kind of money that would allow the new company to launch a product within a few years, but NT could slowly but surely move forward without being disrupted by regular rounds of funding and presentations to fund managers. "(p. 185)

"They called it [the company, not the child] Ganymede, a name reminiscent of a Goethe poem and the Turkish word ganimet, meaning 'something hard won'." (p. 181)

Here is a possible explanation why BioNTech is written with a big NT in the middle, the NT stands for "New Technologies" and offers many nice new ways to misspell the company name.

The company name "Ganymed" is not only reminiscent of a Goethe poem, it is the title of a Goethe poem.

As in the morning light / You glow around me, / Springtime, beloved! / With a thousandfold bliss of love / Pressing against my heart / Your eternal warmth / Holy feeling / Infinite beauty!

That I want to take you / In this arm! / Alas, on your bosom / I lie, languishing, / And your flowers, your grass / Press against my heart. / You cool the burning / thirst in my bosom, / lovely morning wind! / Calls the nightingale / Loving me from the misty valley.

I'm coming, I'm coming! / To where? Ah, where to?

Up! You're striving up. / The clouds float / Downward, the clouds / Bend down to longing love. / To me! To me! / In your lap / Up! / Encompassing! / Up to your bosom, / All-loving father![5]

I hate poetry interpretation, especially when it comes to meter (which doesn't really exist here), an absolute school trauma. Therefore, I will NOT interpret the poem. To be honest, the linked interpretation doesn't really give much. Were it not for Ganymede as the title of the poem, at least the first part could be a despicable love tearjerker from a love-drunk drunk to his current life companion or a love poem to nature. The last stanza only makes it clear through the kidnapping described that this is not the case.

Ganymede was Zeus' cupbearer and formerly a shepherd boy of somewhat confused origins as to tradition, whom Zeus kidnapped because he fell in love with him or at least lusted after him. Here we have the motif of homosexual pedophilia including child abduction by the exclusive class of parasites that stylize themselves as gods. The parents are fobbed off with material assets (horses and a golden vine). Of course, all because the child was so beautiful and should live among the gods. The child was probably not asked. As a reward (or because Zeus got tired of him because maybe Ganymede did grow up after all?) Ganymede became a constellation, so disposed of without leaving a corpse.

Unlike biotech companies that are doomed to die, Ganymede became an immortal constellation.

That's what I call passion when naming this company: hard won, the most beautiful of the beautiful, loved and coveted by the gods and ultimately a constellation in the firmament.

It is also exciting that Ugur and Özlem, despite their passion, never got beyond the preclinical phase in their first company. So there is no experience with real clinical studies on humans from the previous company either.

Ganymede was forcibly sold to Astellas due to pressure from investor Nextech, who wanted their money back at a profit. And that against the will and desire of the founders, who were very attached to their first company baby. The sale of Ganymed hit Özlem particularly hard.

"The transaction was bittersweet for Özlem. She had hoped to bring the therapy to market through an accelerated approval process, so that patients around the world could already benefit from it while a phase III study was still being conducted and without having to wait for it to be completed (emphasis added). to me). Instead, Özlem and her team went through an elaborate handover process, at the end of which Astellas decided to conduct their own large-scale global studies, which would last up to and including the end of 2021.

However, after the sale of Ganymed, Özlem was able to join the board of BioNTech. With a number of deals in the pipeline, the principal investors wanted her to serve as chief medical officer on the board to advance the company's many diverse technologies into clinical trials. Özlem hesitated because she didn't want to go through the same thing as with Ganymede and "lose another baby" (emphasis mine)."(p. 194)

Özlem had a big dream with Ganymede. Bringing such an ingenious drug onto the market that the world could be "blessed" while the clinical study was still in progress, without really conclusive data that would rule out long-term side effects. That sounds familiar to me somehow. When exactly was experimental gene therapy rolled out worldwide? During the ongoing phase III study, the data for which are not yet finally available to date (03/2023)? Has someone fulfilled a dream?

Astellas, the experienced buyers of Ganymed, first put the brakes on and brought the study into the calm, regulated, risk-optimized waters that were actually common in the pharmaceutical industry back then, in the pre-Corona period. Back then, when people were still trying to appear and preferred to have chronically ill patients rather than dead patients.

What actually became of this large-scale study that was supposed to last until 2021? Does anyone have a study number or info on whether it was another non-starter like everything Ugur has hatched so far? Unfortunately, the footer has been saved again at this point.

When founding BioNTech, Ugur was more cautious and had learned his lesson when it came to investors. He wanted to make sure his NT project wouldn't be sold under his butt again, breaking his wife's heart again.

"He would agree to a 'No Questions Asked' clause, meaning the brothers [Strüngmanns] would not interfere in the affairs of the company for at least the first few years and the trio would be free to go in any direction they wanted. At Ugur's request, and to show that they had long-term interests, Athos also agreed to waive the "right to force a sale" (my emphasis) until 2023 - giving BioNTech fifteen years of stability, headroom, most founders can only dream of." (p. 187)

This gallows period would have expired this year (2023) if Ugur had not been able to buy his way out of the investors with a big coup. Coincidence? Calculation? calculation? Did he buy his way out or otherwise pacify investors in some other way?

When it became clear that the couple would have to part ways with Ganymede, they already began looking for investors for their new project. First negotiations took place in the Villa Rothschild on page 189:

"Back at the villa, the two paused under an oil painting showing some of the fathers and mothers of Germany's constitution as they gathered at this site after World War II to set the country on the path to renewal. Neither Ugur nor Jeggle, who had not yet got to know each other properly, dared to speak their thoughts out loud. Overwhelmed with emotion, they envisioned that one day another artwork might hang alongside, depicting the moment of BioNTech's birth (emphasis mine)."

(On the advice of my lawyer, some passages had to be blacked out and the associated footnotes deleted. Since Substack does not blacken, it had to be geixxt over it. Perhaps, when times are different at some point, there will be an uncensored version like Goethe's "Götz von Berlichingen". Although... it was still censored when I was at school, although everyone knew what it ultimately said.)

Although Ugur has taken care to preserve the independence of BioNTech as much as possible, or maybe because he has taken care, the company gets into first financial difficulties in 2013 and has to go begging again because they still haven't made it at least once to start a phase II study, as they had promised their investors. So, as usual, things are going really well for Ugur with his ingenious ideas.

"But in 2013, five years after BioNTech was founded, the phase II studies that Ugur and Özlem had promised the Strüngmanns were still not in sight. Other pharmaceutical industry executives began urging Jeggle to withdraw funds provided by Athos; the company, one warned, would "just burn money." BioNTech's biggest competitors were about to overtake the Mainz scientists, at least that's how it seemed to outsiders. In March 2013, Anglo-Swedish pharmaceutical giant AstraZeneca announced an agreement with mRNA company Moderna that included an upfront payment of \$240 million. Months later, the biotech received an additional \$25 million from DARPA(emphasis mine), an offshoot of the US Department of Defense. In Europe, the German company CureVac had signed contracts with Johnson & Johnson (my emphasis), the French company Sanofi and the Gates Foundation (my emphasis). BioNTech's investors were dying to close similar deals. There simply wasn't enough money to fund everything from Ugur and Özlem's ideas to clinical application. Outside funding would soon be needed, and they wanted to know what their company's innovations were worth in the marketplace now. Ugur reluctantly agreed to Sean Marett sounding out the situation. [...] he signed the first cooperation agreement with Eli Lilly from Indianapolis in 2015. The American company agreed to invest a total of 60 million dollars, in return for licensing potential cancer immunotherapy drugs. Larger and increasingly lucrative deals followed with Danish company Genmab and then Sanofi. At Ugur's urging, however, 50:50 cooperations were concluded this time. BioNTech, Ugur insisted, would not give up its independence easily, and the board promptly rebuffed a number of banker takeover attempts. (emphasis mine)" (p.191) and the board promptly rejected a series of takeover attempts by bankers. (emphasis mine)" (p.191)

Ugur's paranoia about maintaining BioNTech's independence is highlighted again here. Ugur also doesn't seem to have coped with the loss of Ganymed that well. He does everything to ensure that no one can talk into him again or sell the company under his butt. He begins to spin a spider's web of collaborations as a financial safety net.

"But within weeks, BioNTech had begun negotiations with the most successful of all biotechnology companies, San Francisco-based Genentech, worshiped almost like a god in Silicon Valley circles. In September 2016, the company, which was acquired by Swiss firm F. Hoffmann-La Roche, agreed to make an upfront payment of \$310 million to secure an equal partnership with BioNTech. Despite his skepticism about collaborating with big pharma, Ugur saw this as an opportunity."(p. 182)

In September 2017, according to page 197, there was another rain of money from Credit Suisse investors: "The balance sheet of this afternoon was \$270 million,[6] which BioNTech received in this "Series A", the first round of financing, which represented the sixth-largest amount for a biotech company in the world. With this money, it was possible for the company to build the production facilities in Mainz in which the crucial Covid 19 vaccine doses for the clinical studies were manufactured at the beginning of 2020. An even larger round of funding followed in July 2019, with BioNTech raising another \$325 million, mostly from previous backers. That was 61 percent of all investments in German biotech companies in 2019.[7]"

Let's sum it up roughly:

2007: 150 million euros - Strüngmanns and MIG (p. 185)

2008: Foundation of BioNTech (p. 189)

"During this time, BioNTech deliberately remained more or less unknown. "We built the company according to our ideas, brick by brick," explains Ugur."(p. 189)

2015: \$60 million – Eli Lilly (p. 191)

2016: \$310 million – Genentech (p. 192)

2016: 1.2 billion euros minus the share that went to the investors - Sale of Ganymede to Astellas

2017: \$270 million - Credit Suisse (p. 197)

2019: \$325 million (p. 198) - topped up by previous investors

2019: \$150 million IPO in NY (p. 199)

Back then, "Ugur and Özlem took their daughter out to Times Square to see their second baby's name (emphasis mine) light up."

How the daughter feels as a child 3? Somehow she was never counted, otherwise it would have to be called the third baby. The daughter would then probably be the sandwich child in the middle. Did she smurf? One would have to ask Ugur.

To be honest, I'm not in the mood for mathematics right now, because I still don't have the funding from the Gates Foundation, the money from the BMBF funding programs, and I would have to convert the dollars into euros at the exchange rate at the time.

That doesn't advance the storyline and doesn't change the fact that BioNTech was 400 million lousy at the time of the storyline. They burned a lot of coal and so far (2023) there is still no really safe and working product on the market, but the first complaints have been made[8th].

Incidentally, the author is wrong when he claims that "Unlike Moderna, BioNTech did not have extensive US government subsidies [9]"(p. 199). At that time, BioNTech did have funding from the BMBF, just not to the same extent (a total of 4.1 million euros).[10]. But perhaps the author is not entirely wrong. The funding structures in Germany and the USA are different. As a US company, Moderna received public US funding and BioNTech was

financed by the state research funding of the Federal Ministry of Education and Research (BMBF) that is customary in Germany.

"However, being in the glare of the stock market public also had disadvantages. BioNTech now had to update investors every three months on its progress, define goals and explain if and why it had missed them. Also, after the lackluster New York listing, the company had to raise additional cash to fund the development of its drugs."(p. 199)

The hunt for the money does not end even after the IPO BUT you now have investors on your back who really finally want results and, above all, you must not lie to the stock exchange supervisory authority, otherwise you will have a problem.

As it turns out, BioNTech also had more respect or fear of the US Securities and Exchange Commission than of the German citizen and his anger if the scam were to be exposed. In any case, one did not dare to lie to the stock exchange supervisory authority. So it admitted in its 2019 annual report that "mRNA therapies classified as gene therapy drugs"[11][12]something that the German media and the Ehrlich Paul Institute vehemently denied and called a conspiracy theory. However, conspiracy theories are usually more entertaining than a stock market report. However, we already had the topic in a previous chapter: a beaver was christened "carp", but it nevertheless remained a land mammal.

Fun fact on the side: Do you still remember the JP Morgan Healthcare Conference from Chapter 1? Guess who BioNTech's banker is? Exactly! JP Morgen (p. 198). So not the Sparkasse or Volksbank Mainz, in case you thought so.

After this digression into the past and prehistory of BioNTech and Ganymed, including annoying financial matters (biologists get pimples from big numbers and financial stuff), the historical digression goes back to the year 2014, when BioNTech started begging Pfizer for a cooperation (p .200). For three years, Pfizer seems to have ignored BioNTech's advances, which inspires the author on page 200 to write a frustrated "Pfizer didn't seem like a well-coordinated company". How could this billion-dollar corporation dare to starve such a small Mainzer Klitsche on the long arm? Didn't they see the genius of the underlying ideas? They were soooooo mean at Pfizer.

In 2017, this attitude suddenly changes.

"As Pfizer in November 2017(emphasis mine) at the Bio-Europe conference to meet with BioNTech, Kissel went there as well. But suddenly the company was pushing and was

particularly interested in BioNTech's small but growing infectious disease pipeline." (p. 201)

2017... there was something? Ever heard of the SPARS Papers or the infamous October 2017 SPARS Pandemic Scenario at the Johns Hopkins Center for Health Security?[13]?

The year 2017 is definitely just a coincidence and that Pfizer suddenly, a month after SPARS, was interested in BioNTech, waaaaaaaaaaaaaaaa definitely a coincidence.

The SPARS pdf has some really fun stuff in Chapter 19 "The Aftermath". "Health Authorities" were advised to admit their mistakes after the pandemic phase and to show empathy with the population damaged by vaccination and measures[14]. In general, the SPARS exercise is about a very structured vaccination campaign in the context of a "coronavirus pandemic" from 2025-2028. A focus of the exercise was how to convince communities to be vaccinated.

There are coincidences.

Philipp Dormitzer suddenly wants to know "whether BioNTech was willing to work on the development of a new flu vaccine." (p. 201) Incidentally, this flu vaccine still doesn't exist and the modRNA flu vaccine from Moderna was a non-starter[15][16][17], as I explained in detail in my analysis of Chapter 5.

At this point, an interesting scientist also enters the stage of the drama on page 202: "Kathrin Jansen[18], a German-born microbiologist who led the development of the world's first cervical cancer vaccine and was rewarded with leading Pfizer's vaccine research department."

Coincidences again and again. Kathrinsche let out a completely different saying, for which she may be better known among those who refuse to use the mess: "We flew the plane while we were building it[19]", exactly THE Kathrin Jansen. Since both Ugur and Katrin are "driven by science" (p. 203), a personal friendship develops between Ugur's and Katrin's family.

In July 2018, BioNTech signs the cooperation agreements with Pfizer (p. 203), which ultimately laid the foundation for the disaster that unfolded before our eyes from 2020 onwards.

On March 3, 2020 (p. 204), Ugur calls Katrin to maybe sort out the cooperation somehow through official channels: "On March 3, Ugur called Kathrin Jansen and asked for a

cooperation again. This time the reaction was markedly different. She cut him off even before he had finished his argument for expanding the alliance between BioNTech and Pfizer to develop a Covid-19 vaccine. "I said: 'Perfect' because mRNA meets all the criteria," she recalls. "I had no doubt that it was the right technology for the job." Basically, the company was on board."

Again, Ugur talks about mRNA instead of modRNA, although that was actually clarified in the previous chapters. It's really annoyingly inconsistent.

And again Ugur can't get enough of it. Rather than being happy that Pfizer is finally on board, here's a quote on page 206 from Ugurs himself: ""I was worried that partnering with Pfizer might slow down the project because risk-averse corporations want to see more data before moving on to the next pass the phase," says Uğur. "It was important to me to lay down ground rules, one of which was that if one party wants to move forward at any point, the other cannot stop it." Another rationale was that BioNTech wanted to maintain its independence, which Uğur and Özlem had fought for after the Ganymede experience and which had been made possible by the Strüngmanns. Unlike the flu vaccine, this should be a 50/50 deal, Uğur suggested. Here there would be no David and no Goliath. The companies would split the costs and potential profits equally."

The guy who has no idea about corona viruses, no idea about protein design, has never successfully completed a clinical study beyond the preclinical level, has no one in the company who would know about it, now sets rules so that nobody slows him down when he shit? 1. The vaccine turns out to be useless snake oil. People are still dying from the virus.

2. The vaccine turns out to be not very good and only protects a few at least from severe courses. Still, a lot of people die.

B) From the point of view of an evil cross-scoundrel:

"Reuters soon got wind of the talks in New York and informed the world public, including BioNTech's strategic partnership and licensing officer, Roshni Bhakta."(p. 207)

I am guessing the press release quoted on page 177 (which of course has no attribution) is this March 13, 2020 announcement "Pfizer Outlines Five-Point Plan to Battle COVID-19[21]".

"Once the relationship was solidified, the agreement with Fosun took off. It was negotiated by Ryan Richardson and Uğur with little input from BioNTech's corporate development team. The agreement was much more straightforward, essentially a license agreement. There were no intellectual property or technology transfer concerns. Fosun was supposed to help BioNTech conduct clinical trials in China, but the German company would manufacture the country's vaccine at its European plants and ship it to Asia.

On Monday, March 16, BioNTech announced a "strategic alliance" with Fosun under which the company would pay up to \$135 million for the right to commercialize the product in China, Hong Kong, Taiwan and Macau. The press release also served as a public announcement of the existence of "Project Lightspeed". The venture had been kept secret for seven weeks while dozens of pharmaceutical companies announced their intentions to develop a vaccine against the coronavirus far and wide.[22]"(p. 209)

Oddly enough, the Chinese themselves did not want to use the BioNTech smurf substance in their own population[23]. They paid 135 million dollars for a marketing right, only to not make use of it and even refuse to use it. Did they maybe make sure with the marketing rights that the modRNA stuff can't be offered by anyone in their country because they have the rights? Kinda weird. "One example was the cost of patented vaccine components. Pfizer agreed to cover its prospective partner for that eventuality. However, the company tried to use this generosity as bargaining chips as issue after issue was discussed, from sharing liability (emphasis mine) to where each company's name would appear on the vials."

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



With the inflationary flood of reports on criminal activities in the context of the production and use of experimental gene therapy injections with the recombinant genetically engineered Covid-19 active ingredients ("SARS-CoV-2 or corona vaccination", see [A]), is a notable article [1] by investigative UK journalist Sonja Elijha [2] almost disappeared. The meticulous research results of the former BBC researcher could well have the potential to be a game changer in the legal processing and conviction of those responsible for what is probably the biggest scientific fraud and medical scandal in human history. This publication by Elijah is discussed in detail and expertly reviewed under the keyword #blotgate in relevant specialist circles [3].

Elijah had already made enormous contributions to the analysis of the leaked Pfizer documents and correspondence in connection with the telescoped clinical trial phases [4]. She carried out exactly those tests that are actually intended for the specialist departments of the approval authorities at the EMA (European Medicines Agency) and FDA (US Food and Drug Administration). According to the current state of knowledge, these authorities have the BfARM (Federal Institute for Drugs and Medical Devices), PEI (Paul Ehrlich Institute) and IQWiG (Institute for Quality and Efficiency in Health Care), as well as the Peer review processes in the relevant scientific journals [5] have totally failed across the board. Such a structural failure can neither be explained by negligence nor by chance, but probably only by deliberate intentional collusion to fraud. This is by no means surprising given the entry into the age of dependence on third-party funds and the ominous public-private

partnership. These fundamental changes in previously independent and tax-funded research have turned the once largely neutral and objective scientific institutions into institutes for contract research, industrial corruption and courtesy reports. This also made it possible for the pharmaceutical industry to essentially finance those regulatory authorities that are actually supposed to control it [6]. At the EMA they even managed to immediately prior to the issuance of the first conditional Covid-19 drug approval in December 2020, to place a pharmaceutical lobbyist (Emer Cooke) as President of this institution in November 2020 [7]. A rogue who thinks evil about it.

Background: what is it about?

A brief recapitulation of what has been determined so far makes it easier to understand the complex molecular-biological instrumental analytical relationships on which Elijah's new investigation results are based.

Already in January 2021, the cell biologist Dr. Vanessa Schmidt-Krüger analyzed the EMA Open Assessment Report on Corminaty (the Pfizer/BioNTech Covid-19 gene therapy "vaccine") [8, 34]. A key point of their criticism concerned the complete ambiguity of the end product composition from large-scale industrial production, which the EMA inspectors had also noticed. The decisive factor was the finding that, in contrast to the documentation of the modRNA integrity (a purity measure that indicates how much completely intact modRNA is contained in the samples) in the laboratory scale in the clinical studies was 78%, in contrast to 55% in industrial mass production. The intact modRNA is characterized by an initial so-called 5' cap structure, the coding nucleotide sequence for the protein to be translated (in this case the SARS-CoV-2 spike protein) and a so-called final 3` poly-A tail. In addition, the original SARS-CoV-2 mRNA (messenger RNA [9]) in the active substance (tozinameran) by Comirnaty was modified by replacing the nucleobase uracil with pseudouridine (therefore modRNA [10]) in order to reduce reactogenicity. A membranebound anchor protein is added to the coding sequence, which prevents the formation of free cardiovascular circulating spike proteins, and a lock protein (2P lock) is inserted, which should prevent the cleavage (at the so-called furin cleavage site) and opening of the binding sites of the S1 subunit [11]. Both of the latter modifications have now turned out to be ineffective, so that the freely circulating spike proteins from the Pfizer poison cocktail can fully develop their well-known toxic properties in the organism. The reduced modRNA integrity criticized by the EMA auditors entails an enormous risk potential for patients. A differentiated analysis of the brew from the Pfizer pharmacy boilers revealed fragmented (so-called truncated sa [1(a), 3] #humpgate) modRNA, of which nobody knows what foreign proteins it may express. Also included were residual components of linearized DNA and various enzymes from the modRNA synthesis process, as well as other microbiological impurities. The reduced modRNA integrity criticized by the EMA auditors entails an enormous risk potential for patients. A differentiated analysis of the brew from the Pfizer pharmacy boilers revealed fragmented (so-called truncated sa [1(a), 3] #humpgate) modRNA, of which nobody knows what foreign proteins it may express. It is also questionable to what extent the minimized active ingredient content can still achieve the postulated effect (immune reaction and antibody formation). After all, the EMA examiners asked a key question that should have been answered conclusively in the approval documents in advance. In this respect, the experimentally documented proof requested by the EMA for end product verification, including through so-called Western blot analysis [12], is of essential importance for consumer safety.

The fact that there is a significant, unacceptable benefit-risk ratio for the Covid-19 gene therapy injections was proven at the latest with the disclosure of the study results from the clinical trial phases. How Pfizer tricked and deceived there was revealed on the one hand by a whistleblower (Brook Jackson) who has served as study coordinator of the clinical trial phases for a subcontractor (Ventavia).[13], on the other hand, the study manipulations were made possible by viewing internal Pfizer documents, by court-ordered exposure in the United States, after Pfizer had tried in vain to prevent access to the records for more than 70 years. Sonja Elijah and Dr. It is thanks to Naomi Wolf, a renowned writer, political activist and former Clinton adviser, that the content of the first 55,000-page installment [14] could be made available to the public [15]. All in all, the approval authorities were littered with no less than 400,000 pages of application documents from Pfizer [16]. One had probably hoped to tie up the authorities with this bundle of attachments on the one hand and thus enable the misuse of the substances for the time being, as well as to hide the crucial data falsifications in them and prevent their discovery. This strategy has so far worked for the registration authorities, However, the pharmaceutical fraudsters significantly underestimated the meticulousness and perseverance of the critical scientists and investigative journalists. The summary of the document review concerns inadmissible unblinding and arbitrary exclusion of study participants, which in the statistical evaluation to be corrected (which was never carried out) proves a complete failure of the active substance [17], which was later confirmed in practice with exploding incidence values and hospitalization rates of "vaccinated" [18], hushed-up deaths and serious side effects, unqualified study staff in the care of test subjects, improper relocation, formal errors, etc. And the approval authority (FDA) involved actively supported it. An unbelievable chain of failure from a scientific point of view, on the other hand, an almost perfect interplay of organized crime. Interestingly, in an annual report from March 2022 to the US Securities and Exchange Commission (SEC), Pfizer reveals its knowledge of the previously described deficiencies of the preparation to be tested and the consequences of its use. There, in the subjunctive, the financial market and investors are informed that the safety and effectiveness of the Covid-19 drug may not be proven [19]. Instead of the 400,000 pages of application documents, the approval authorities would only have had to read the few pages of the SEC annual report in order to temporarily suspend the approval process. until the necessary verifiable experimental and clinical benefit-risk evidence had been finally presented by Pfizer. Instead, an application of active ingredients to billions of ignorant test subjects was authorized, intentionally violating the duty of care and supervision for consumer protection. The fact that the extent of the damage was not even greater can be related to a possible further perversion of the pharmaceutical mafia activities. When assigning the SAE (Serious Adverse Event) to the active substance batches, it was particularly noticeable that only some of them were particularly harmful [20], while others sometimes showed no reactions at all, not even locally at the injection site. It would therefore be quite conceivable that the manufacturers, knowing about the enormous risk potential and the consequential damage that could then be seen, delivered batches of placebo (e.g. with isotonic saline solution), with which they were also able to rake in further enormous profits through the higher margins compared to the much more expensive verum preparation [21]. In addition, it is completely unclear for the composition of the final administration of active ingredients to the patient that in the supply chain practice, compliance with the low-temperature cold chain (-80°C!) from the manufacturer to the

pharmaceutical wholesaler, to the pharmacies to the executing doctor, especially in the summer months [22]. Also grossly negligent for the entire development process was the ignoring of the warnings by the pioneers and inventors of mRNA drug technology, Dr. Robert Malone and Dr. Luigi Warren that this pharmacological application in humans is not yet fully developed [23]. As if all of this wasn't incomprehensible enough, consumer protection was also almost completely undermined by law through the clandestine introduction of the Medical Needs Supply Assurance Ordinance (MedBVSV), which was only enacted for the Covid-19 active ingredients and eliminated numerous essential quality assurance requirements of the AMG [24].

The importance of the EMA intervention

On the basis of these findings, the mixture of active ingredients can definitely be described as a haematological bioweapon [26] in the context of the collateral damage [25], which has meanwhile been adequately documented, or as a genocide cocktail due to the mass use that has meanwhile taken place.

All quality assurance standards disregarded

With the Pfizer/BioNTech Covid-19 active ingredient, the regulatory authorities have disregarded all gold standards of quality assurance that have been established for decades and simply waved the approval through, despite the unacceptable product risks. The manufacturers were given until mid-2021 to submit the corrective measures later, ie the injection campaign was officially authorized to begin before the quality assurance measures were even ensured. In addition, the three most important regulatory authorities worldwide (FDA, MHRA {UK Medicines and Healthcare products Regulatory Agency}, EMA) had already agreed to coordinate a common date for the conditional or emergency approval, which is foreseeable in any case before the final one product certification lay as internal emails from high-ranking officials that have since been leaked show [35]. No wonder that those who have been injected ("vaccinated") are literally executed in gene therapy (or by contaminated batches) or experience serious side effects, as the pharmacovigilance data (even with enormous underrecording and considerable delay in reporting!) clearly document [36]..." "Even the smallest amounts of the spike protein are sufficient in cell culture to cause infected and uninfected cells to fuse and die."



What all vaccines have in common, however, is that our cells then produce the viral spike protein and present it on their cell surface - this gives the immune system the incentive to remember this protein.

Targeting vaccine proteins

But how well does this principle work? And how perfectly do our cells mimic the viral protein? Yasunori Watanabe from the University of Southampton and his colleagues have now investigated this using the example of the AstraZeneca vaccine AZD1222. What is important here is how well the vaccine proteins reproduce the viral protein structure, but also whether the sugar deposits typical of this protein match - because these glycans are also a recognition feature for the antibodies.

For their study, the researchers vaccinated various human cell cultures with the vaccine viruses of this vaccine. After these cells had then read the assembly instructions and formed the first viral proteins, they used antibody tests and high-resolution images of cryo-electron microscopy to check how well the viral model and cellular vaccine product matched.

"Prickly" cells and structure to match

The result: around 60 to 70 percent of all cells in the inoculated culture showed the typical prickly spike proteins on their cell surface after a short time, as the images show. "They revealed that the surface of these cells is densely covered with protruding structures whose shape and size match the conformation of the SARS-CoV-2 spike protein," report Watanabe and his colleagues.

The structure of these cell-produced spike proteins corresponds to that shown by the virus before attachment to the cell. Tests with different antibodies also showed that both the binding site and the three-part "head" of the protein and the stalk region correspond to the original - at least so well that the antibodies successfully bound to it, as the team reports."
